#### Superintendent's Report: Angus Wilson

RATS (5x tests) – got to most schools; started distributing – then got warning from PHO. Froze distribution on Friday am – elementary aged kids parents need to pick up. Process continues to unfold...

Graffiti – Facilities Director reported on high cost of vandalism (incl. graffiti; destruction of toilets etc.) this year. Seems provincewide, not just a Mission phenomenon. Working to address...

*Next issue – will soon be article featuring FV superindendants discussing floods.* 

Board meeting will be discussing Summit – online learning school – changes to rules from MOE coming into effect this September. Will make operating online schools more difficult – more restrictions and hoops to jump through. Hoping to draw down and close off K-7 summit moving forward; continuing on with 8-12. [~30 (possibly 36) students in K-7 Summit]

Indigenous Credit Grad Requirement – typical student achieves 96 credits and you need 80 credits to graduate – certain courses that you must take (Language Arts, Social Studies etc.). Are several courses being made available and credits will be cross listed (i.e., 1 course = 2 credits (BC First Peoples 12 = Social Studies and Indigenous credit)

- Language courses will also be available (counts as indigenous course credit as well)
- Requirement applies to kids currently enrolled in grade 10.

#### a. Middle School Model - discussion

Revisiting today...where to go from here – survey? etc. Need to bring to COTW.

Angus update: MS and SS met for 30mins – discussed start to how we got here; talked about positives of what has gone well; areas of concern

- 1- Update for people not here a decade ago (history of how we got to where we are)
- 2- Talked about at MS growth in educational opportunities (supports and electives) [i.e., greater voice for LGBTQ b/c concentrated in one school rather than split b/w 3]; less conflict (i.e., west v. east side); also, considerable # of electives at SS.

3- Feelings amongst staff re: seniority and picking where you get to go; considerably less culture developed b/c school only 3yrs long; sports (7-8) – limited interaction b/c younger MS; bad habits forming earlier (esp. truancy; discipline issues; expulsions); difficult transitions; demographic issues (declining enrollment is no longer an issue but q now is how large you want MS to get).
